



MGCA Convention Report by Ed Culbert, Editor, The Garden Spray

The 1991 Men's Garden Club convention was held at the Sheraton Imperial Hotel in Research Triangle Park, near Winston-Salem, North Carolina. The hotel was located in a marvelous pine forest. The weather was about 20 degrees cooler than Minneapolis, and the meeting rooms were on the cold side, too.

The seminars were mostly top quality. The tours visited some fine gardens, ranging from large to small. There were many flowers on the tour, including one garden devoted entirely to wild flowers, but few vegetables. The food was good (no one was poisoned this year), but there were too many drawings and too many awards. The luncheon and dinner speeches were pure humor, with no attempt to give a garden message. Barbara Culbert admitted to being 85+ and won a pair of earrings as the oldest woman in attendance. She beat her nearest competitor by one month.

Kent Petterson attempted to delay implementation of the new By-Laws by one year. There were accusations they were being railroaded through. The discussion was heated both at the Delegate's meeting and at the Director's meeting. Kent's motion lost 41 to 86.
