# \*JANUARY SPEAKER \*

Our speaker for the January 13th program is Neil Anderson, Associate Professor at the U. of MN and director of its herbaceous perennial breeding program. His presentation will be on the topic of Breeding Winter Hardy Herbaceous Perennials.

Dr. Anderson has experience in the commercial flower seed industry as a flower breeder and new crop specialist. His areas of expertise include new crop development, winter hardiness, reproductive barriers, interspecific hybridization, and preventing invasiveness. His research program focuses on winter hardiness and invasiveness of herbaceous perennials.

Gladiolus, Gladiolus, development of seedpropagated, winter

hardy dwarf types that are fragrant.

Dr. Anderson directs the U's trials for annual bedding plants and herbaceous perennials (testing the perennials for winter hardiness).

His program supplies plants for the club's Perennial Trial Garden at Lyndale Park.

#### MGCM Receives \$500.00 Grant for Scholarships

In December the club was received a check from Northwestern Mutual for \$500.00 to support our scholarship funding. Their quiet grant program under the sponsorship of club member Bob Livingston had provided \$1000.00 last year as well based on applications submitted by member Kent Petterson.

The scholarship program was established in 1992 to honor our club's 50th Anniversary. Over the years due to the success of our public biennial garden tours and the generosity of the club we have been able to award forty-eight scholarships to students of horticulture in Minnesota.

### Presenting the Outstanding Service Award to... Archie Caple

For many years, going back to 1948, it has been the custom of MGCM, at its annual Christmas meeting, to make an award to one of its members for outstanding service, not only to the club but to the gardening community as well. This award was originally known as the Bronze Medal, but when the club disassociated itself from the national organization, the name of the award was changed to the Outstanding Service Award. It is my pleasure to announce the recipient of this year's award is my longstanding friend and fellow gardener, Archie Caple.

I feel especially pleased to make this presentation as Archie and I, in 1977, were members of the first class in Hennepin County to attend classes at the University of Minnesota for becoming Master Gardeners, as part of the Extension Service of the University. What is especially interesting is that Archie and I are the only remaining active members of that class of some 20 people. Today the Master Gardeners number over 200 people.

Archie as a Master Gardener has taken part in a great number of programs to benefit the gardening community, but I think one of his outstanding accomplishments has been instilling the love of gardening in the young people in the community.

Archie as a young man had an experience that showed his early interest in gardening. While serving in the Air Force in England in World War II, he met and visited with the Royal Gardener of the British Royal Palace. But that wasn't Archie's only outstanding experience during the war. That's also when he married his lovely wife Jean.

Besides being a fine gardener, Archie is also an excellent wood worker. I hope some day you'll be able to see his wood shop, but you may not recognize it. You'll think it's the living room. It is immaculate.

But what has Archie done for our club? He became a member in 1975.

In 1978 while employed by Northwest Airlines as Director of Internal Security, he was able to use some of their equipment to take pictures of our members in order to prepare a picture directory. That may not sound like such a great accomplishment to some of our younger members today, but it was a significant accomplishment before computers and digital cameras were as common as they now are.
