MGCM Awards four \$500 Scholarships in 2011

The Scholarship Committee met in October to read and consider applications received by the October 15 deadline for our scholarship offer. Information and forms for applications were posted on the club website and letters of notification are sent to each post secondary school in Minnesota that has a formal horticulture program. The members present were Maury, John Sims, Merle Pulley, Jan Johnson and Kent Petterson. Out of ten applicants we selected the following four.

Myra Pehoski is a senior in Greenhouse Production and Entrepreneurship at the University of Minnesota St. Paul Campus. Myra is President of the Horticulture Club and has been a 'peer coach' for incoming students in the department. Her leadership and enthusiasm for horticulture plus strong recommendations brought her support from the committee.

Alex Plattes, a senior, is also a student at the U of M studying Horticultural Science with a special interest in landscape restoration. Alex has worked on research for breeding of lilies. Interned with Earth Kind Garden Design, Traveled to Costa Rica for study, and interned with the USDA Conservation Service in New York. Alex interest in plants has sparked his 'thinking like a designer or critic of landscapes'. He's our kind of guy.

Brady Voss expects to complete his studies at Anoka Technical Collage in Dec. of 2012 wit advanced degrees anticipated. Brady has already started his own landscape and gardening business. With great recommendations, he is a top student, motivated and involved with a 'passion for the industry beyond words'. We didn't think we could go wrong backing this guy.

Courtney Vikeras is completing her studies at Rochester Community Technical College in Horticulture Technology in June of 2012. MGCM Completes Scholarship Matching Grant!

In the last Spray we announced the generous donation of \$1,000 to the club's dedicated Scholarship Fund by Jan Johnson. In addition she challenged us to donate collectively \$1,000, which she would then match with a second donation of \$1,000. In just over a month, tax-deductible donations totaling at least the required amount were received to complete the match.

As a 501c3 non-profit organization, all donations to the Men's Garden Club of Minneapolis for the Scholarship dedicated fund are fully deductible on your tax return. This includes a donation of securities. The club was offered such a donation, but receipt of securities required creation of a brokerage account in the club name into which the stock could be transferred. Thanks to the work of Andy Marlow with our bank and quick response by the Board of Directors, an account was created and as of this writing additional donation of stock valued at approximately \$2,000 was received. This donation is anonymous.

On behalf of the Scholarship Committee and the entire club, I would like to thank all of our members who were able to help with their generous donations. Special thanks to Jan for her example this year and last that has taught us how we can use our status as a non-profit to raise money to help young students who are studying horticulture.

MGCM Member Survey News



This is the first of several articles in which the survey committee (Don Untiedt, Gary DeGrande and Andy Marlow) will be sharing with the membership results of the survey many of you took in November and December. Participation in the survey was outstanding. 74 of the 98 active members took the survey. That's 75% of the membership. 50% is usually considered a high level of participation.

The first and simplest part of the survey looked at the demographics of our club. There were not a lot of surprises there:

Age

We all know most of our members are more mature. The largest percentage (57.1%) is over 65 years of age. Only 4.3% were under age 45. About 13% were between 46 and 55 years, while just over a quarter are 56 to 65 years old.




What is your produc? Midle Fertale

Gender


Of the 72 members who answered this question, 30 were women (41.7%) and 42 were men (58.3%).

Geography

By far the vast majority of members live in Minneapolis or its suburbs. 31.9% live in Minneapolis proper, while 37.7% (the largest number) live in the Western suburbs. 4.3% live in St. Paul and an equal percentage in the Eastern suburbs. The remaining members live in the Northern (10.1%) or Southern (11.6%) suburbs, which are shared by the two central cities.



Longevity of Membership



The survey committee was very pleased to see the spread of years of membership of those responding to the survey. We feared the more senior members would be more likely to participate, people who have been members 0-5 years actually were the most numerous (27.1%). 6-10 year members were next at 20% and those who have been members 25+ years were at 17.1%.

Next month we'll look at the reasons people join MGCM and how people feel about our meeting format.

Old Business:

The Board voted to approve Nona Johnson, Kristine Hughes and Stephen Shubick as Rookies of the year.

The Board approved a motion dedicating the profit from the sale of MGCM hats to the Scholarship fund.

- In 2012 Board meetings will be held at 6:30 at central locations on the first Monday of the month. The first meeting will be January 3, 2012.

President's report: President Kay Wolfe praised the Board's work this year and said a good-by to those who are leaving. She was especially proud that we had the programs planned for 2012, that the board has conducted a survey of the total membership, and that we have Hospitality and Catering committees helping to organize the dinner meetings.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:15 p.m.
