




June Meeting: Map to Lakewood Cemetery Buildings

Here are short descriptions of each of these stellar gardens:

Mary Witkus & Werner Koeler, South Minneapolis

Japanese gardens compliment this Asian influenced home on Minnehaha Creek. Flowing water adds to the feeling of tranquility. Many plants are those found in Japan, others are more hardy adaptations suited to our climate. Sculptural elements were chosen for their rustic beauty and patina.

Lee & Jerry Shannon, St. Paul

Plant collectors both, Lee and Jerry have turned 2/3rds of an acre into garden rooms showcasing the results of their collecting efforts from around the world. Rock gardens, a dwarf conifer collection and a wisteria covered archway leading to a formal garden are only a few, plus the roof top of their potting shed.

Steve & Linda Shubick, St. Paul

How much garden can you pack into a St. Paul city lot? Steve, an award-winning hosta exhibitor, grows those prize winners just north of Macalester College. While he emphasizes hostas in all their many varieties, plenty of shade-loving companions grow along-side. Creatively potted plants abound as well.

Gary deGrande & Mary Boss, White Bear Township

Mix four years living in France and frequent trips "up North" inspired a garden that looks like something Claude Monet would paint if he grew up in Ely, MN. Throw in a two-level pond with a connecting stream, lots of native plants mixed with colorful annuals and perennials, and you have a one-of-a-kind paradise.

Monica & George Morin, White Bear Lake

Roam nearly an acre of woodland gardens with redbud, serviceberry, viburnum and witch hazel beneath basswood, birch, elm, fir, maple, pine and spruce along 800 feet of walking paths. The gardens are home to hostas, ferns, roses, wild flowers and interesting garden structures

Keith & Sandy Miller, Stillwater

Over 1200 varieties of hosta grace the Miller garden. A pond doubles as drainage from the cul-desac and a perfect setting for the hostas and companion plants. Water from the pond is pumped up to a creek, which passes over several waterfalls on its way back to the pond.

Then select away according to the rules and send your jpeg files to Lloyd Wittstock at 913 19th Avenue SE, Minneapolis, MN 55414. All entries will be judged by real people for photographic quality in the presentation of horticultural subjects. The entrant with the most points will have the photo trophy with their name engraved under the list of the many previous winners. The person whose single photo is judged best in show will win a gift card, and all will win through the satisfaction of participating.

The prints go into the part of the contest that is **for members only.** You can print two of your favorite photos, with horticultural content, and mail them to us, but, please, by July 31. This part is called the People's Choice, because it is decided by ballots cast at the Flower, Food and Foto show in August, with more chances to win gift cards.

Enter your photos in both parts of the contest or in just one. We will take as many as you care to send in up to the maximum. We look forward to the competition, especially with all the fine examples we have seen already in the *Spray*. Let's hope we get to see even more at the Arboretum on August 16 and 17.
