## October Program Roses Return: New Hardy Shrub Roses for the North David Zlesak



Our presenter at the October meeting is David Zlesak, who will be giving a program on "New Hardy Shrub Roses for the North." David is an Associate Professor of Horticulture at the University of Wisconsin River Falls, and he has been interested in breeding roses since he was a boy. Some of his notable rose cultivars include the 'Oso Happy' TM series, and the new for 2015 yellow climbing rose 'Above and Beyond' TM, currently being grown by Bailey Nurseries as part of their First Editions product line. Roses aren't his only interest; he's also developed 'Tuscan Sun' heliopsis, 'Monarch Mediano' TM and 'Monarch Grande' TM ageratum, and 'Little Devil' TM ninebark, also a First Editions plant.

#### **Notes from the Prez**

The nominating committee of the MWGCM must present a slate of Board of Directors nominees for confirmation by the membership at the November meeting. While our roster of current directors has renewed its commitment for 2016, I'm sorry to report that despite our best efforts we cannot find anyone who will serve as Vice President next year.

For those of you who are new to the club, the VP serves a one year term, then moves on to the President's position for a year, and then they're Past President for a final year. The duties of each can be found in the member handbook. Club tradition holds that members serve only one year in each position, and once they've served they're not asked to serve again. In addition, potential VP/Pres nominees are usually seen as members who have been in the club for at least a few years and have been active on committees and at events. Well, given the fact that we're running out of people to ask, I believe the qualifying criteria should be relaxed. If someone enjoyed being President and the club feels they were good at it, why not have them return in the role rather than badgering others who clearly don't want to take it on? What's more, I think Past President should be a purely symbolic position, with no expectation that they serve on the Board for a third year. But that would require a change to the By-Laws...

Now, I've heard from several long-time members about how this is a perennial problem, how years ago they had to ask a dozen people before one accepted. But it's different today because if we stick with our qualifying requirements there are so few left to ask.

Look, I know it's a big commitment, but I've been President while working full time, as have two other recent Presidents, and many more before them. The worst part of the job, by far, is trying to find next year's VP!

Somebody needs to step up, so that's why we're loosening the "qualifications". We're asking anyone, regardless of whether they've served as

President in the past, or just joined the club last year, to stand as our VP nominee. Partner with someone as Co-Presidents; it could be a wonderful opportunity for two members to blend their skills and experience to form a great team. And the new VP can be assured that they will have my full support along with that of Judy Brooke and the rest of the Board to assist them in any way we can.

We're willing to depart from tradition in our search for a VP because if no one will come forward, we don't know what the alternative is. Please contact me if you have any questions.

#### 2015 Scholarship Update

The Scholarship Committee has updated the Club's application information and forms this year. The new information has been posted on the club website and forwarded to all of the schools in Minnesota that have Horticulture programs.

We have been promised from the schools that we will have a better response to our anticipated offer of three scholarships of \$1000. One of our efforts this year was to verify that our scholarship size was adequate and that was confirmed by all of the schools. The deadline for application is October 16<sup>th</sup>. After consideration and recommendation from the Scholarship Committee the board will be asked to approve the recommended recipients. Each student recipient will be invited to our Holiday Party in December.

We were able to verify that our list of schools was accurate and have updated the individual contact persons in each case to maximize our exposure to students. In addition to offering hard copy information, this year we have sent our application information in PDF form via email and have received email confirmation of receipt from all the schools. We are optimistic that our response will be much improved this year.

#### November Preview - Hosta Hunting in Japan - Continued from Page 1

Hostas are a plant species native to Japan. With very few exceptions all hostas originated there, and the thousands of cultivars now available are the result of mutations and/or hybrids of about 40 Japanese species.

In the summer of 1995 Roger Koopmans, Bob Olson and a group of hosta aficionados traveled to Japan looking for Japanese species growing in the wilds, and to visit Japanese specialty nurseries in search of mutants, sports and exotic hybrid hostas. With the aid of a Japanese guide and professional plant hunters they climbed mountains, forded raging streams and trekked to hidden waterfalls to find them.



If you take a look at these "before" and "after" photos of the garden, you'll realize how excited the Native Garden crew is about what the summer has brought. We went from 10" of mulch covering everything that was there, to a bed that is filling with native plants chosen for pollinators. The dozen or more people who stopped by for the September tour were gracious, and

generous with their praise, as are the visitors who stop by when the crew is working there on Wednesday mornings. Once in a while the visitors even come back to help weed, under the watchful eye of a member of the crew.

If you want to see the garden, it is located between the Peace Garden on the west and the club's the formal border garden on the east. Between our two beds you'll see hostas and mums and a few peonies moved out of the two MWGCM gardens, and will also notice the overgrown beds maintained by the park gardeners when they have time -- the Hummingbird/Native Garden is expanding slightly that direction.

#### Lyndale Park Garden History: "Supporting Lyndale Park since 1952"

The MWGCM has a long history of community service in Lyndale Park in Minneapolis. I am often asked where is Lyndale Park? It's near Lake Harriet, the same park that is home to the Rose Garden and Peace Garden. And where did the name come from? The name "Lyndale Park" was taken from the name of William King's farm, Lyndale Farm, which once surrounded Lake Harriet. Around 1890 King donated much of the land for Lyndale Park, as well as most of the land around Lake Harriet, to the park board. King named his farm after his father, Lyndon King, a preacher from upstate New York, where William King was raised. The name of the park was stipulated when the land was donated.



The Men's Garden Club of Minneapolis was founded in 1942. In 1952 to celebrate their 10<sup>th</sup> anniversary the club planned a civic interest project. They donated and planted a new variety of crab apple tree in Lyndale Park. There is contradicting information as to how many were planted – the numbers ranging from 50 and 200! A Minneapolis Park Board brochure stated 200 trees were planted; MGCM members have told me 50 were planted. I am inclined to believe 50 – 50 trees is a lot to plant – but 200 would be overwhelming. In July of 2008 the club held an outdoor dinner program in Lyndale Park. Club members spoke about the history of the club's projects there. We took a walking tour, and there were 3 of the 1952 crab apples still growing. Today all of these trees are gone.

Here is an interesting article from the July 1952 Spray:

OUR 10th ANNIVERSARY 'CIVIC INTEREST PROJECT

Those of you who have not recently visited the Flowering Crab Apple Trees planted by members of the club in the Lyndale Gardens will be happy to know that they are all (except one) leafing out nicely - thanks to our careful planting and the attention being given them by the Park Board gardeners.

As time goes on we are going to be mighty proud of what we hope is only the beginning of a real contribution by the Men's Garden Club of Minneapolis to the beautification of the city. Your officers, executive committee and the past presidents' committee who engineered this Civic Interest Project wish to thank the entire membership for their loyal support in making this project possible by contributing the trees, and a special vote of thanks to those who turned out en masse to assist in planting them.

We will indeed be ever grateful to the Park Board Commissioners, officers and staff for affording us the opportunity to engage in such a project, and for their unstinting cooperation and assistance in the consummation of what we feel is but the first objective in the club's long-range "Civic Interest" activity.
