Wrapping Things Up!

The garden is a little quieter this time of year but there are still things to do. If you subscribe to the theory that you want to leave the garden in autumn the way you wish to find it in the spring then you must try to get those chores done quickly before the days get too short and the temperatures drop. If you don't mind waiting until spring to clean up those dried out perennials and simply leave some of the spent blooms with the seeds exposed for the birds and to add a little winter interest then some of the pressure is off to get your garden completely cleaned up.

Bulbs still can be planted into early November as long as you plan on watering them until the ground freezes. Tools need to be cleaned, sharpened and oiled so they will be ready for you in the spring. If you feed the birds the feeding stations need to be prepared in readiness for the winter season. Bags of leaves should be gathered so that you can cover perennial beds and roses after the ground freezes to help insulate them for the winter and to help protect them from the freeze/thaw conditions we experience in our climate. If you purchased trees, shrubs, or perennials that did not get planted you will need to heel them in to your garden beds so they can be transplanted in the spring. After all of that is done, you may want to get those twinkle lights up in your trees before it is too cold to do so. Whew!

November is the month we conduct our annual business meeting. This year we are revising our bylaws along with electing new officers and board members. Please renew your memberships this month so that the 2014 directory can be prepared for printing. For those of you who are chairpersons of committees please let me know if

you are willing to continue in those positions for the 2014 season. If you are serving on committees in 2013 you will be automatically listed as members of that committee again for 2014 unless you indicate otherwise.

If you plan on donating any items for the silent auction in December please be in contact with the Holiday Party committee for instructions on how to do so.

Make your plans now for MWGCM's holiday party **Tuesday**, **Dec. 10** at the Embassy Suites. The address is 2800 American Blvd. West, Bloomington. There will be a map in next month's Spray.

The party begins at 6 p.m. in one of the party rooms. There will be signs pointing us in the right direction just inside the front lobby.

The cost of this year's party is \$23, due at Larry's house no later than **Saturday**, **Nov. 30**. If you are attending but believe your payment will not arrive by that date, please call or email me to let me know you will be attending. This is necessary because MWGCM must pay Embassy Suites in full by Dec. 4.

The dinner will include turkey, dressing, mashed potatoes, vegetable, dinner salad, desert, coffee, milk and/or water. Punch with cheese and crackers will also be provided before the meal. No alcoholic service will be provided at the dinner table but everyone will have the opportunity to walk down a very short hall and order a drink or glass of wine from the Embassy Suites bar and bring it back to the dinner.

A silent auction will take place. Bidding will be open from 6 p.m. until 7 p.m. Silent auction winners will be notified after the business meeting. There will be four cashiers open to take payment for silent auction items in order to speed up this process. Please pay by check or exact change, as we cannot provide change at all four checkout locations.

Silent auction items can be brought to any home of a holiday committee member prior to the party, and it is highly recommended you do that. You can also bring them to the hotel the evening of the party. As of now, we do not have a designated holding room for these items, so please do not bring items to the hotel until 4:30 p.m.

The holiday committee members will be setting up our party room from 5-6 p.m., but most of the committee members will be there at 4:30 p.m. to accept silent auction items. No one may enter the party room during set up except holiday committee members. If you bring your silent auction item between 4:30 and 6 p.m., a holiday committee member will be available to take the item into the party room and have it displayed on the tables. You can then wait in the lounge until the party room opens at 6 p.m.

This is our first year at the new location, so please be patient.

Lyndale Park Garden News

MWGCM creates a public garden in Lyndale Park in Minneapolis. Lyndale Park is the "umbrella" name for the large park near Lake Harriet that is home to the Rose Garden and Peace Garden, all property of the Minneapolis Park and Recreation Board. The MWGCM has a partnership with the MPRB through their "Park Steward" program, and we not only maintain the garden, but design it and donate the plants as well. The MWGCM garden is a 300 foot border garden running along the boundary of the park and Lakewood Cemetery, and is part Perennial Trial Garden, and part Perennial Mixed Border Garden. On display is a collection of small trees, coniferous and deciduous shrubs, perennials, ornamental grasses and annuals, all artfully arranged by texture and leaf color. Almost all of the trees and shrubs have been donated by the MWGCM over the years. We hope the garden gives home owners ideas for plants that they can dependably use in their own gardens.

This summer the Minneapolis Park Board allowed us to purchase edging bricks for the long winding edge of the garden. The committee has been busy installing them, and we are almost done with the project. Thanks so much to everyone that has worked in the park garden this summer!

Nowadays when we are working at the park, citizens continually stop and thank us. Everyone seems to know that we are the volunteers that create the garden, and they are so glad to have such a place of beauty in the city park. Thanks to the club members for providing funds for this important community service project.
