2020 OFFICERS & BOARD OF DIRECTORS NOMINEES


The Nominating Committee of the MWGCM must present a slate of Officers and Board of Directors nominees for confirmation by the membership at the November 12, 2019 annual meeting.

NATIVE GARDEN BECOMES MONARCH WAYSTATION



In addition to spring ephemerals, something new will pop up in our Native Garden next year--a sign identifying the garden as a registered Monarch Waystation. You've probably seen the signs, or maybe you have one. The Monarch Watch Organization developed this program to help provide and conserve resources--primarily milkweeds and nectar sources--for migrating monarchs. We are now one of more than 26,500 registered Monarch Waystations in the U.S., Canada and Mexico.

for us.

Deane Fund Grants Update

MINNESOTA VETERANS' HOME OF MINNEAPOLIS DAY CENTER COURTYARD

The work completed last fall and this year has reestablished the Veterans' Day Center Courtyard as an inviting and functional space for veterans to enjoy for activities and special events.

As of September, twelve club members have removed all the dead

trees and shrubs. In addition, one club member had two of her teenage grandsons help for four hours each. This brings the total number of hours on this project so far to 152. On September 19, the group pruned all the remaining trees and shrubs and prepared the courtyard for the Veterans' Annual Family Picnic. Sixty-



five veterans and family members attended.

We were not able to finish the project this year due to a delay in locating underground utilities. However, we were able to plant shrubs, ferns, grasses and donated hostas. We also spread shredded bark and installed a stone path. To finish the project, we need to move existing shrubs to make room for new ones.

When completed, the group feels we have reached our goal of hardy, low-maintenance plants and enhanced visual appeal of the courtyard for the future.
